Woodlands Christian enrolls students who have demonstrated average to highly exceptional intellectual ability and offers appropriately paced instruction to accommodate this range of ability in its college preparatory curriculum. The high school graduated its first class in May 2001.

GRADE POINT AVERAGES

Cumulative GPA is computed over all high school courses. Numeric grades reported on transcripts are unweighted. Honors courses are weighted with .5 quality point and AP courses with 1 quality point in GPA calculation.

GRADE POINT SYSTEM

Student GPA is weighted on a 5.0 scale.

Examples:

100%: AP = 6, Pre-AP/Honors = 5.75, College Prep = 5
95%: AP = 5.5, Pre-AP/Honors = 5.25, College Prep = 4.5
90%: AP = 5, Pre-AP/Honors = 4.75, College Prep = 4

THE ACADEMIC PROGRAM Woodlands Christian maintains a rigorous college preparatory curriculum. 100% of our graduates are admitted to four-year colleges or universities. The curriculum in the high school includes college preparatory, honors, Pre-AP and advanced placement courses. Students must maintain a minimum average grade of 85% in Honors and Pre-AP course or 90% in a college prep course for AP course consideration.

Current Honors and Pre-AP courses (11): Pre-AP English I, Pre-AP English II, Pre-AP Biology, Pre-AP Chemistry, Honors Anatomy, Honors Engineering & Design with Capstone, Honors Geometry, Pre-AP Algebra II, Pre-AP Pre-Calculus, Pre-AP Computer Science, and Honors Spanish III.

Current AP courses (17): U.S. History, World History, Government, Macroeconomics, Biology, Chemistry, Physics 1, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, Psychology, Computer Science A, Computer Science Principles, AP Spanish, AP Studio Art, and AP Drawing.

Foreign Language options currently consist of Spanish, Latin, French, Mandarin, and German.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE ACADEMIC PROGRAM

Students are required to take English, mathematics, science, and history all four years of high school.

Over half of our graduates complete at least one AP course.

Project-based learning and Socratic methodology is ingrained throughout the curriculum.

The Woodlands Christian Academy is an Apple Distinguished School for our use of technology to create a blended digital learning environment for our students in PreK-12th grade. The ADS designation is reserved for programs that meet criteria for innovation, leadership, and educational excellence, and demonstrate Apple’s vision of exemplary learning environments.

A variety of online courses are available to all students and reflect the same high academic standards as onsite-taught courses.
