Content (65 points)	Introduction is attention getting, lays out the review in a cohesive manner, and establishes a framework for the rest of the presentation.	5	
	Informs the committee of the book's content, thoroughly using appropriate, academic language.	15	
	Presents an in depth critique of the book's quality.	15	
	Material included is relevant to the overall message/purpose.	10	
	Appropriate amount of material is prepared, and points made reflect well their relative importance.	15	
	There is an obvious conclusion summarizing the presentation.	5	
Presentation (35 points)	Speaker maintains good eye contact with the committee and is appropriately animated (e.g., gestures, moving around, etc.).	10	
	Speaker uses a clear, audible voice.	10	
	Delivery is poised, controlled, and smooth.	5	
	Visual aids are well-prepared, informative, effective, and not distracting. (Visual aids are optional.)	5	
	Length of presentation is within the assigned time limits. (10-15 minutes) and is representative of an in depth critique of the book.	5
